Brantley Lake State Park, a southern desert park, and the southernmost lake in New Mexico is a refreshing place to fish, enjoy water sports and year-round camping for visitors. The visitor center includes historical exhibits about the Wild West Town of Seven Rivers.

Brantley Lake attracts recreational boaters, fishermen, sailboats, windsurfers, and water skiers. The lake is large and there is plenty of room for motorboats, sailboats and even a few canoes and kayaks. Windsurfers have discovered that there is nothing in the desert to block the spring winds.

Anglers can catch a variety of warm water fish such as largemouth bass, walleye, channel catfish, white bass, bluegill, and crappie.

The "Go-fly-a-kite" rally is held in March, the "Shoreline Sweep" is a part of the Park's Earth Day celebration in April and the "Kids Fishing Clinic" is held in May. Throughout the summer, Saturday night campground programs are a favorite.

Year-round, vacationers use the park as a base for visiting nearby attractions. Located twelve miles south in the city of Carlsbad is Living Desert Zoo and Gardens State Park. About thirty miles farther south is the spectacular Carlsbad Caverns National Park, which has one of the world's largest cave systems. Another spectacular area is Sitting Bull Falls in the Guadalupe Mountains, about forty miles southwest of the park on State Road 137.

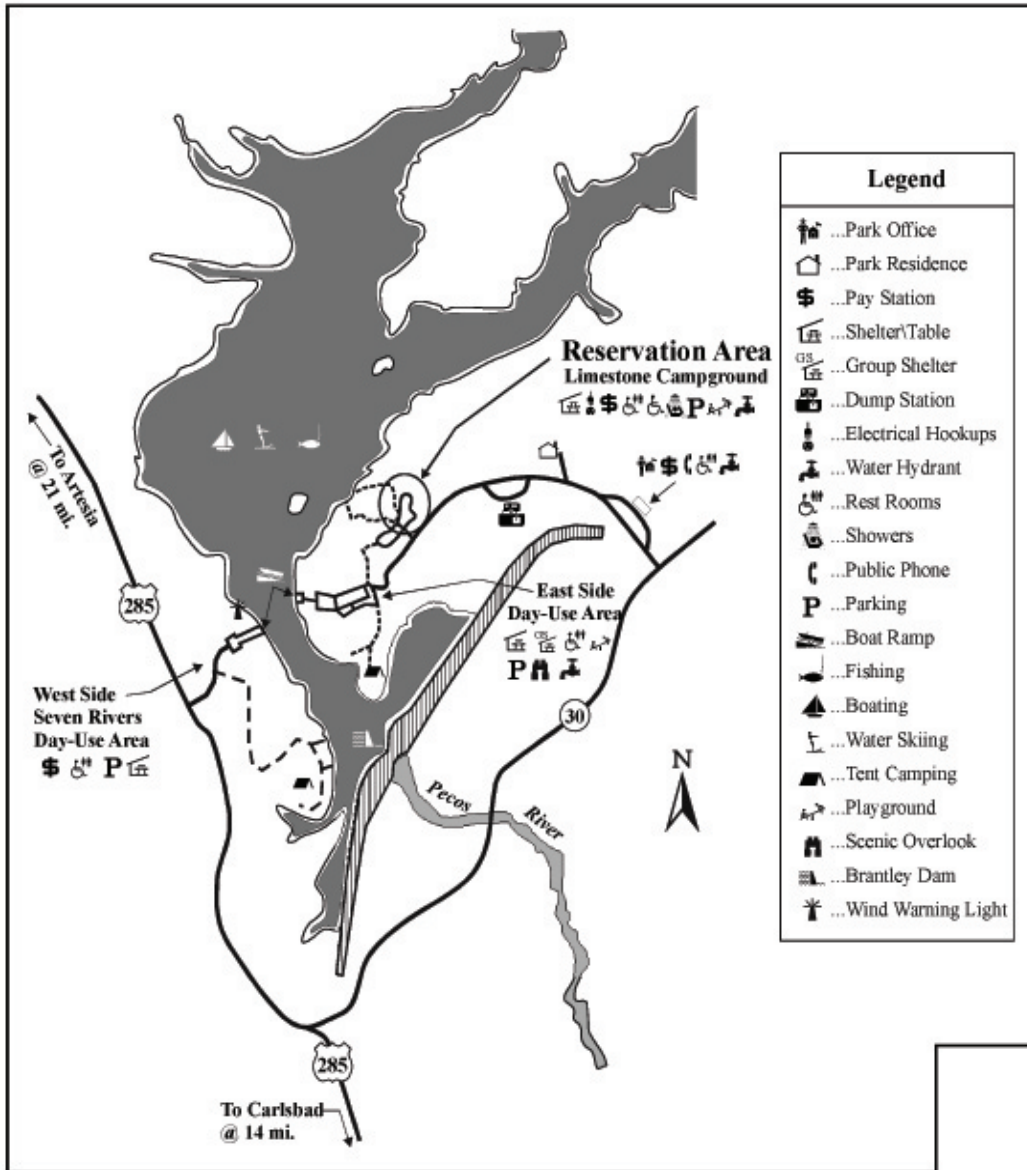
Brantley Lake State Park is 12 miles north of Carlsbad via US 285 and 4.5 miles northeast on Eddy County Road 30.

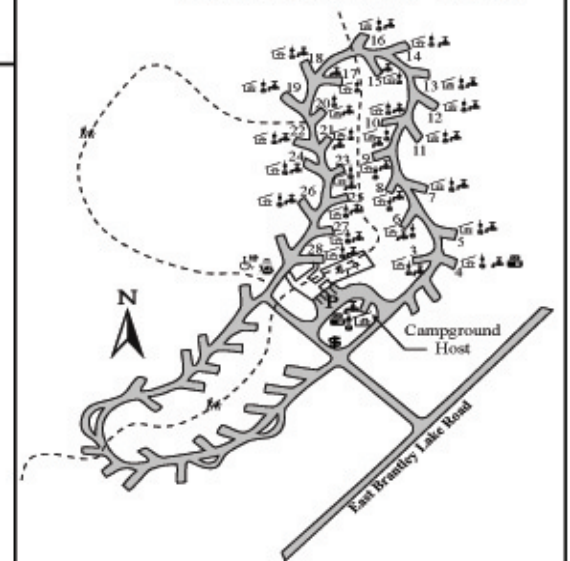
